

Thematic Network Conference 8th of July 2012 in Stockholm



TNSWUA arranged the 8<sup>th</sup> of July 2012 a research seminar on "Social Policy in the High North" and "Social Work with Families" (SWF). The social policy theme will probably be developed and presented at a steering committee meeting in 2013.

Within the SWF project there have been developed a vignette to be used in focus group interview with social workers. There are now collected focus group material from Finland, Russia, Canada, Cuba, Chile, Sweden and Norway. Within the end of October 2012 each researcher will be asked to sign an agreement regarding how to use the collected material.
