Deadlines

<u>Fall Semester</u>

April 1 – Priority Deadline May 1 – Final Deadline for fall

Spring Semester October 15

Students will need to obtain a J-1 visa & enroll in a minimum of 12 credits.

Students are limited to one online course per semester & should review USCIS J-1 visa rules prior to arrival. Students will likely be subject to the 2-year home residency requirement.

REQUIRED APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Exchange Student Application
- Brief Essay
- Letter of support from home school or confirmation of nomination from North 2 North
- Proof of English proficiency
- o Transcript from your home institution
- o A copy of the biographical page of your passport
- Proof of sufficient funding *
- * Students attending USM will need to document \$9,140 for one semester to cover the cost of room, board, books, insurance and personal expenses.
